

But you still continue your habit of praying daily.



We friends chill out like being in Rome.




My Hero

towards the end of the world.





is present in the form of ice and glaciers, rest of the water is safe and that's for us. But, we are misusing it. I continued and said that more than 700 differ-





MISSION GAGANYAAN

We all talk about NASA and its achievements in outer space, we hear about the International Space Station and the research being conducted there. In 1984, Indian astronaut Rakesh Sharma had the opportunity to go to space but that has been it for India. Now, the time has changed and new dawn is upon the country to take its very own 'giant leap'.

The Gaganyaan programme, an indigenous mission that would take Indian astronauts to space, was announced by the prime minister during his Independence Day speech last year.

Gaganyaan is an Indian crewed orbital spacecraft that is intended to send 3 astronauts to space for a minimum of seven days by December 2021, as part of the Indian Human Spaceflight Programme.

The spacecraft, which is being developed by the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), consists of a service module and a crew module, collectively known as the Orbital Module.

It will be for the first time that India will launch its manned mission to space, making the country fourth in line to have sent a human to space. ISRO's Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV Mk III), the three-stage heavy-lift launch vehicle, will be used to launch Gaganyaan as it has the necessary payload capability.

GSLV Mk III is designed to carry 4 ton class of satellites into Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO) or about 10 tons to Low Earth Orbit (LEO). The power


ful cryogenic stage of GSLV Mk III enables it to place heavy payloads into LEO's of 600 km altitude. The launcher uses two S200 solid rocket boosters to provide the huge amount of thrust required for lift off.




Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced the Gaganyaan mission during his Independence Day speech earlier last year. Earlier in November, ISRO Chairman K Sivan said, "Our PM has declared a great gift for all of us that is #Gaganyaan mission."

The Indian space agency displayed the Gaganyaan crew model and orange space suits at the Bengaluru Space Expo's 6th edition earlier last year. The space suit were developed at Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, Thiruvananthapuram.

Rs 10,000-crore mission will be a turning point in India's space journey. ISRO has developed some critical technologies like re-entry mission capability, crew escape system, crew module configuration, thermal protection system, deceleration and flotation system, sub-systems of life support system required for Mission Gaganyaan.






doctor, do you ask for his or her college mark sheet? No, you trust the doctor's skills to cure you.

If the Seven Wonders of the World were materials, plastic would've been at the top and the second would've been plastic, the third- plastic and all of them plastic. Imagine, one day, when you wake up and realise that all the plastic from the world has vanished, you would regret you hadn't enjoyed the past because without plastic, the human race would not survive.

That's because plastic is the wonder material. You won't be getting your new dress that you just ordered on Amazon if plastic wouldn't have been light-weight, flexible and highly durable. Thank plastic that you haven't burnt in an electric fire and you have a secure water pipeline in your house. You think plastic can break easily? Then you surely don't know what bridges are made of.

Plastic is a saviour of humans from the climate change. Polythene is intensively used to make carry-bags which are a far better option than paper or cloth-bags. Paper-bags lead to the cutting of extensive areas of forests which would boost the global epidemic- global warming. Even if a tiny percentage, specifically speaking, only 2% of the wooden boxes would be changed to plastic, the world would be saving almost 1,200 hectares of our green lungs- forests which involves over 1 lakh trees.

Have you heard about any safety hazards posed by plastic? Surely you might have and surely might have believed it too; but what if it was a hoax? And indeed, it was a hoax. You might've read that – 'the plastic (called polyethylene terephthalate or PET) used in bottles contains a potentially carcinogenic element (called DEHA). The bottles are safe for one-time use only. Repeated washing can cause the plastic to break down and carcinogens can leach into the water that you are drinking'.

This was actually a poorly-conducted thesis which lacked enough scientific proof and was written by a student. Right from the drinking glass you've held in your hand to the aircrafts flying about

40,000 feet above the ground, plastic is used in our everyday life. It is water-proof and a great insulator.

Plastic has played a vital role throughout the history of spaceflight, allowing astronauts to view their surroundings, breathe oxygen and travel comfortably in space. Without plastics, space exploration would not be where it is today. Also, according to studies generating energy from plastic garbage can reduce volume of municipal solid waste to be landfilled by 90%. In the United States alone, there are now over 100 energy recovery plants operating, spread over 32 states, generating enough electricity to meet the power needs of 1.2 million houses and businesses.

Lastly, the most often-asked question, what about the disposal of plastic? Instead of seeing it as non-biodegradable and the biggest littering problem, see that plastic has after-life too. It is recyclable and reusable because of which it would save trees which would reduce overall carbon emission and which would ultimately save the world. You can't blame plastic if people dump them anywhere. Plastics are not a problem, the people who litter them are a problem; they need to be educated of the ways to dispose plastic properly. Plastic industry gives employment to unimaginable number of people in India.

There are uncountable places where you see them – chairs, jars, containers, fridge, dustbins, cell phones, air conditioners, televisions, plastic helmets, mouth guards, goggles and the list never stops.





The Environment of Hate in Current Times




